



Respite/Short-Term Care Charges for the 2024/25 Financial Year

The Social Services and Well-Being Act (Wales) 2014 was introduced on 6th April 2016 and, therefore, from that date both Respite and Short-Term placements are assessed under non-residential rules. From 10th April 2023 this will be subject to a maximum £100.00 weekly cap.

This applies to people having Respite (which at the point of admission is for a maximum of 6 weeks) or Short-Term placement (where the placement is not expected to exceed 8 continuous weeks at point of placement).

Please note that charges apply for any Non-Residential Services received from Monday to Sunday night inclusive. If a person is in respite or a Short-Term placement for 1 night only their maximum contribution will not exceed their assessed charge. The maximum weekly cap of £100.00 is not a pro-rata cap.

If you have already been assessed for non-residential services for the 2024/25 financial year the assessment will apply for any Respite/Short-Term placements and you will not be charged more than your assessed maximum weekly contribution in any given week.
