The Inspector has concluded that, with the recommended changes outlined in his report incorporated into the LDP, the Plan satisfies the requirements of Section 64 (5) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 and meets the tests of soundness set out in LDP Wales.

The Council must now adopt the Plan – this is required to take place within 8 weeks of the date of receipt of the Inspector's report.

When adopted, the Ceredigion County Council Local Development Plan will become the Development Plan for Ceredigion and will provide a basis for decisions on land use planning in this area. It will supersede the Dyfed Structure Plan (1991) & the unadopted Ceredigion Unitary Development Plan (2001 – 2016).
