Climate and Nature : PSB Delivery Group Update Climate Change Risk Assessment (CCRA)		<i>Discussion and Agreement</i>
Crynodeb o'r Materion / Summary of Issues		
<p>Following the appointment of Miller Research the initial stages for the preparation of a Regional (Ceredigion & Carmarthenshire) Climate Change Risk Assessment (CCRA) has commenced to provide an evidence-based foundation for future adaptation planning and the development of Well-being plans.</p> <p>Desk research is in the process of being undertaken along with the prioritisation of the risks, and three stakeholder workshop sessions diarised on 15th January, 29th January & 4th February. The initial workshop session held on the 15th January was a Ceredigion specific local workshop, providing 15 attendees from Ceredigion PSB partners with the opportunity to consider the prioritisation of climate risks for the County. This work would bring Ceredigion in line with previous work undertaken in Carmarthenshire in preparation for the following workshop sessions. One joint workshop session has been held on the 29th January, having secured 15 attendees and the final session is diarised to take place on the 4th February.</p> <p>PSB partners are urged to engage with this work and please note that to further complement the workshop sessions, individual stakeholder discussions are being arranged by Miller with key lead officers based within PSB partner organisations. An initial contact list for Miller comprises NRW, Ceredigion County Council, Hywel Dda University Health Board, Mid and West Wales Fire & Rescue Service, Dyfed Powys Police and Aberystwyth University however we would urge any additional partner to contact us if they have missed the workshop sessions and wish to engage directly with Miller Research via these stakeholder discussions.</p> <p>In consideration of your response to this work please note the following background: Climate change is already affecting communities, services and the natural environment across Wales, through flooding, extreme weather, impacts on health and wellbeing, and pressure on ecosystems, infrastructure, and local communities. Public bodies have a shared responsibility to understand these risks and plan how best to respond over the short, medium, and long term.</p> <p>Your input will directly inform the Joint Baseline Risk Register and help ensure the CCRA is practical, locally relevant and focused on the issues that matter most.</p>		

Miller Research will report to the PSB following completion of this stage of the work which is scheduled to be completed by the end of March 2026.
