




About This Strategy

Priorities For 2024 - 2027




Ceredigion is still one of the safest places to live in the United Kingdom.

We found that people sometimes worried about crime even though it doesn't happen very often in our county.



We wanted to make sure that we reduce crime, but also make sure that people feel safe in the community.

We will use different ways of working to do this.

Our Crime Priorities



Our first priority will look to tackle **Crime** in Ceredigion.

We will focus on -



1. Reducing sexual offences.



2. Reducing violence against women and girls.




3. Reducing the illegal supply of drugs and substance misuse.

How Will We Know We're On Track?



We have 4 Groups which will be carrying out our work.

These are –



- 1. **Tactical Group** This group focusses on **operational** work.
- CONTEST Board This group delivers on the UK Government's Counter Terrorism Strategy.



3. **SVOC Board** – This group focusses on serious violence, organised crime and substance misuse.




Integrated Offender

Hard to Understand Words

Sexual Offences – A sexual act directed at someone without them agreeing to it.

Violence Against Women and Girls – Violence against women and girls including physical, sexual or mental harm.

Illegal Supply of Drugs – Giving or offering to give someone illegal drugs.

Substance Misuse (Drugs) – Using illegal drugs or medicine in a way that they are not meant to be used.

Substance Misuse (Alcohol) – Drinking alcohol in a way that is harmful.

Burglary – Going into a building without permission to steal something.

Cyber & Online Crime – Using a computer to carry out criminal activity.

Hard to Understand Words

Cold Calling – To visit or phone someone without permission to sell things.

Criminal Damage – When a person causes damage to something on purpose without permission.

Visible Police Presence – Seeing police officers in your area.

Anti-Social Behaviour – A person acts in a way which upsets someone who does not live with them.

Operational – Carrying out work in communities.

Terrorism – Violence or threats carried out by a person or group with a strong political opinion.

Reducing Re-offending – Work with people who are in prison to help them stay away from crime when they are released.

Community Cohesion – Making sure peace is kept in our communities.
