BAM is working in partnership with Ceredigion County Council and AtkinsRéalis Design Consultancy to deliver Aberaeron Coastal Defence Scheme.


## Traffic and pedestrian management

We are making every effort to minimise our impact on residents and visitors to Aberaeron while we work on the flood defences. However, there is a need to manage traffic and pedestrians in order to allow us safe working areas and protect the public. The temporary closures listed below remain in place:

- » The coastal path diversion through Aberaeron
- » Access onto South Beach
- » The pedestrian wooden footbridge across the river Aeron
- » The temporary road closure along Quay Parade has been extended to 20 December 2024 to facilitate the completion of the drainage works.

## What have we been doing?

- » Masonry cladding to the sheet piles in front of Y-Seler. This will be completed when the glass panels arrive from the manufacture.
- » Masonry cladding at Pwll Cam Terrace – as far as we can go. This will be completed when the glass panels arrive from the manufacture.
- » Construction of the North Breakwater.
- » Reconstruction of the South Beach rock revetment and installation of the new timber groynes.
- » Construction of the new inner harbour gate abutments.
- » Excavation and building of the new South Pier foundation. Delivery of the 160t Crawler Crane to assist with the new pierhead construction.
- » Building Quay Parade reinforced concrete wall.
- » Installation of the main line drainage along Quay Parade.

## Key upcoming works

#### **November:**

- » Masonry cladding Quay Parade walls. This will be completed when the glass panels arrive from the manufacture.
- » Continuing installation of the main line drainage along Quay Parade.
- » Construction of the North Breakwater concrete walkway and continuing with rock placement.
- » Construction of the new inner harbour gate abutments and new wall to the Hive.
- » Re-start rebuilding the river wall in front of Toad Hall.
- » Reconstruction of the South Beach rock revetment and installation of the new timber groynes.
- » Construction of the new South Pier foundations.

#### December:

- » Completion of the main line drainage along Quay Parade.
- » Gates installation to Quay Parade.
- » Construction of the North Breakwater concrete walkway and continuing with rock placement.
- » Continuing construction of the new inner harbour gate abutments and new wall to the Hive.
- » Rebuilding the river wall in front of Toad Hall.
- » Reconstruction of the South Beach rock revetment.
- » Construction of the new pierhead to the South Pier.

## January:

- Glass panels installation – Part of River Aeron and the Hive.
- » Gates installation to Quay Parade.
- » Construction of the North Breakwater concrete walkway and continuing with rock placement.
- » Masonry cladding to new inner harbour gate abutments and Hive walls.
- » Construction of a terrace Wall and Kiosk Building at the new gate east Abutment.
- » Rebuilding the river wall in front of Toad Hall.
- » Reconstruction of the South Beach rock revetment.
- » Construction of the new pierhead to the South Pier.
