

An information leaflet about the assessment



### Final Steps

Once a decision has been made by the team, we will contact you regarding the outcome as to whether your child has been given a diagnosis of ASD or not. It will be your decision as to whether you would like feedback over the phone or in clinic, with or without your child.

Whatever the outcome you will receive a report describing your child's profile of strengths and needs with recommendations to help provide understanding and support for your child.

Depending on the outcome of the assessment, you will be given information and may be referred to other services that might be able to help you and your child.

We recommend that the report is shared with other services your child is involved with. This will be discussed with you during the feedback appointment.

Once the findings have been discussed and shared, you will be discharged from the Meurodevelopmental Service. Due to the small size of the team we cannot currently offer direct ongoing support.

## What happens first?

You have been asked to sign a consent form to allow us to gather more information from other services that your child may be involved with.

When we start the assessment you will be asked to fill out questionnaires regarding past medical history, family history, language development, social interaction and imaginative play. You will have opportunity to discuss this information, along with any other current concerns, at some point during the process.

Your child will have an appointment which involves many activities, these are play or activity based. Sometimes your child may be seen on their own you may be asked to wait in a waiting room.

We may need to carry out further assessment which may include another clinic appointment or school visit.

# What happens next?

Once the assessment process is completed, the information will be discussed by the team. Often a decision can be made at this point as to whether a diagnosis of ASD is made or not. Sometimes the team decide further assessment is required. If this occurs you will be informed.

Why has my child been referred to the Neurodevelopmental Service?

You, or people working with your child, may have noticed differences in your child's communication, social skills, and behaviour. As a result, a health or education professional that has met your child has referred them for an ASD assessment. The assessment will focus on whether or not your child

assessment will focus on whether or not your child is presenting differences that are consistent with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

When the referral has been accepted your child will be added to the team's waiting list.



The ASD team meet weekly to discuss cases at a multi-disciplinary meeting.
